

The table below sets out the nature of support being offered to social care providers in the City of Westminster, referred to as Annex B in the letter to local authorities from the Minister of State for Care, Helen Whatley MP, on 14 May 2020.

It should be noted that some providers with which the local authority does not have contracts, and are predominantly accessed by private funders, do occasionally take spot placements from the local authority. This spend has been disaggregated wherever possible and will continue to be refined as this information is updated.
