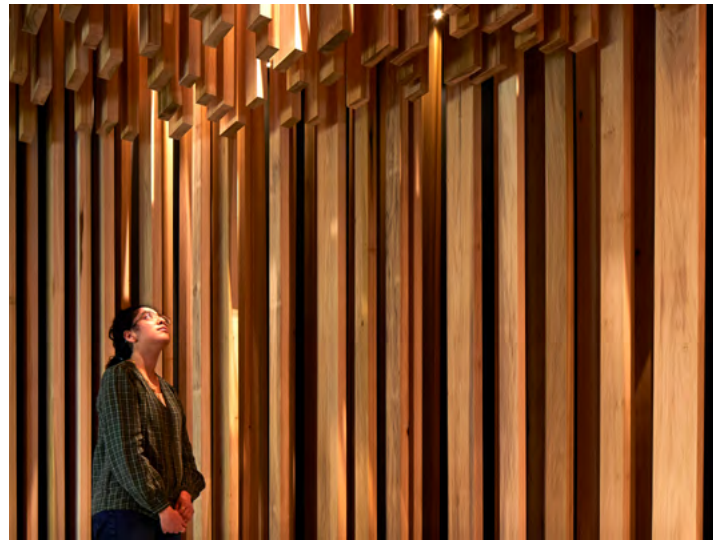

Ever wanted to visit the award-winning Design Museum in Kensington but not had the chance? If you bring a copy of the April edition of North Ken News along with you, you'll get a 50 per cent discount to the current exhibition '**David Adjaye: Making Memory**'.

Celebrated Ghanaian-British architect **Sir David Adjaye** has curated an exhibition about how new monuments and memorials are used to tell powerful stories and address injustices. Monuments are a record of who we are in the world and what we have done. However, do all communities get to be represented equally? And what about the future – can we build monuments to that?

Using full scale models, films and rare objects which inspired his designs, Adjaye has created an emotional journey from Ghana to South Korea, Washington DC and beyond. Featuring projects such as the Smithsonian National Museum of African American History and Culture in Washington DC and the UK Holocaust Memorial and Learning Centre in London, these buildings show how architecture can be used to reflect on history, memory and record human lives.

Additional environmental checks in and around the Grenfell Tower site

In October the Government confirmed that additional environmental checks would be carried out in and around the Grenfell Tower site.

These checks will be carried out by an independent specialist, with Government funding and will be completed in two stages. Stage 1 will be an initial risk assessment and involve collating all relevant background information to identify the areas where the main stage of sampling should be undertaken. Stage 2 will involve carrying out a detailed risk assessment comprising the site investigation and the majority of sampling. The work will then be independently checked by a group of experts in the field, known as the Science Advisory Group.

The local NHS is already offering enhanced health checks to any local resident who has been affected by the Grenfell Tower tragedy. You can arrange this with your GP and more information can be found at www.grenfell.nhs.uk

For the most up-to-date information from the Government, there will be a series of regular updates through local and direct channels, including meetings with community representatives, Ministerial letters and their profile on the Nextdoor app, which you can find by searching 'Grenfell Community Updates - HM Government'. Give us your views on new North Kensington homes

New homes are planned for North Kensington after the Council announced a new much-needed home building programme for the borough.

The programme will deliver a total of 600 homes, including at least 300 homes for genuinely affordable social rent, community spaces and other facilities.

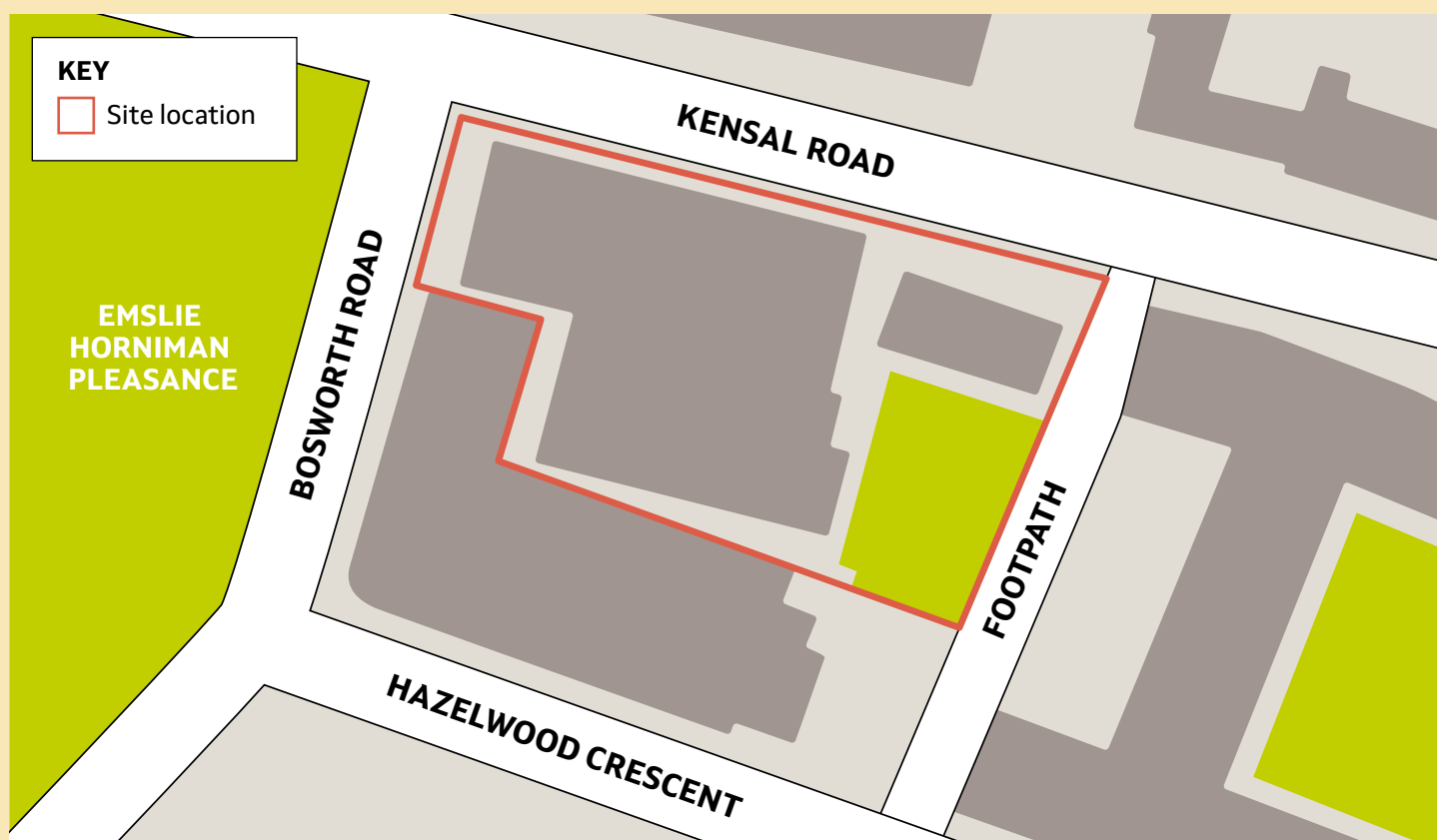
The first Council-owned sites planned are at Kensal Road, Acklam Road, Hewer Street and Barlby Road.

The new Council homes will be built on land which we already own, without the loss of any existing homes. The building of other homes for open market sale and rent will help pay for these new social rent Council homes as part of this plan.

Since the Council announced the programme in October last year, we have started consulting residents in North Kensington about the plans. To date we have held four drop-in sessions, with more planned.

Funding has been awarded by the Greater London Authority; this grant, which is for £33.6m, will help build the social rent homes.

Consultation with local residents and businesses is underway. The Council is using your feedback to form a proposal for each area.

Additional GP appointments available near you

If you live or are registered with a GP in Kensington and Chelsea or Queen's Park and Paddington, there are additional GP appointments available to you at evenings and weekends.

You can make an appointment to see a GP or nurse between 8am and 9pm seven days a week, including bank holidays.

Dr Andrew Steeden, Chair of West London CCG, said: "You can book an appointment by calling your GP practice or **NHS 111** when your own practice is closed. Appointments are available at two local hubs and take place in the evening and at the weekend.

"These additional appointments have been helping patients to see a GP or a nurse at a time more convenient for themselves. Patients who have used GP services in the evening and at weekends at the hubs have told us how great they have found the service and how helpful it is to be able to make an appointment at a time that suits them."

Books for local children to call their own

As founder of the London Children's Book Project, local mum Liberty Venn has been changing the way children access literature in North Kensington and across London.

The project allows for preloved books to find a new lease of life as a gift for a child. The books are donated by families who have outgrown them and are given to the children to own and cherish.

Liberty told us: "When children read a story, all sorts of things happen to their brain. It boosts their imagination, helps them relax and builds self-esteem. When you talk to families about passing on books, they love the idea of a book that brought their children so much joy when they were younger being enjoyed for the first time again."

Liberty piloted the project with the help of **Barlby Primary School** in Dalgarno ward and has rolled it out over the past two years to give all local children the opportunity to enjoy the fantasy and escapism of reading and to give them the pleasure of having a favourite book that is theirs to keep.

As the project has grown it's gone from strength-to-strength, making full use of the warehouse provided by the Council to store books in and creating exciting book gifting events for children both in and out of the borough.

There are 10 pop-up book huts that are taken to schools for children to choose a book from. As well as this the project brings '**Bookshop in a Box**' kits to schools for them to create an immersive and free bookshop setting where children can browse and "purchase" their own books.

Last year the project gave 24,000 books to schools for children to take home. This year the project aims to double their efforts, providing up to 50,000 books.
