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1. Introduction

- 1.1 The Infrastructure Funding Statement (IFS) is an annual report that the CIL Regulations1 require to be published by December each year. The IFS provides a summary of the financial and non-financial developer contributions relating to Section 106 Legal Agreements (S106) and the Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) within the Borough for the reporting year of 01 April 2019 to 31 March 2020.
- 1.2 It also includes a statement of infrastructure projects that the Council intends to be, or may be, wholly or partly funded by CIL.

2. Community Infrastructure Levy Matters

Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) Regulations (2019 Amendment) Regulation 121A Schedule 2 Paragraph 1²

- a) The total value of demand notices issued in the reported period is **£5,352,842**.
- b) The total amount of Borough CIL (BCIL) collected within the reported period was **£5,420,204**. This includes CIL receipts where the demand notice was issued prior to the reported year and CIL payment was received within the reported year.
- c) The amount of BCIL collected prior to the reported period (up until 31 March 2019) totals £13,923,976. The total BCIL collected was collected in Cash and there were no Land Transactions (including payments in kind and infrastructure payments). £470,000 of the BCIL has been allocated. £2,123,581 has been allocated towards Neighbourhood CIL (NCIL) and £696,199 towards BCIL admin. The following amounts remain unallocated:

- d) The total amount of BCIL collected prior to the reported period (up until 31 March 2019) allocated in the reported period (1 April 2019 to 31 March 2020) in relation to cash received is £2,819,780. Of this, £2,123,581 is for Neighbourhood CIL (NCIL) and £696,199 for BCIL Administration. In relation to land payments (including payments in kind and infrastructure payments) is £0.

- g) i) There has been no BCIL spending on items of infrastructure in the reported year.
 - ii) The amount of BCIL spent on repaying money borrowed, including any interest, and details of the items of infrastructure which that money was used to provide (wholly or in part) is **£0**.
 - iii) The amount of CIL collected towards administration expenses is £271,010. This was 5% of the total BCIL receipts collected (£5,420,204.21) in the reported period.

The amount of CIL spent on BCIL administration expenses during the reported year was **£271,010**. This was 5% of the total BCIL collected within the reported year.

Royal Borough of Kensington and Chelsea collects Mayoral CIL (MCIL) on behalf of the Mayor of London. During the reporting year £119,624 was collected as administration for MCIL. Of this amount Royal Borough of Kensington and Chelsea has allocated £119,624 towards administration expenses and all of this has been spent by Royal Borough of Kensington and Chelsea for the administration of collecting CIL on behalf of other charging authorities.

h) Regarding BCIL collected and allocated within the reported year that has not been spent, summary details of what has been allocated, is remaining to be spent and what it has been allocated towards is as follows:

- i) The total amount of CIL passed to a parish council under regulation i) 59A or 59B is $\mathbf{\pounds 0}^3$. There are no parishes in the Borough.
 - ii) BCIL has not been passed to a third party to spend on the provision, improvement, replacement, operation or maintenance of infrastructure under Regulation $59(4)^4$.
- i) The total collected for the reported year under Regulation 59E and j) under Regulation 59F was £813,031⁵. This relates to NCIL which is collected and retained by the Council as the Charging Authority.
 - ii) The amount of BCIL allocated to items of infrastructure during the reported year under Regulation 59E and 59F during the reported year is £0. The Council undertook its first NCIL allocation round between June and August 2020. The allocations made will be reported in the next Infrastructure Funding Statement.

- k) i) and ii) The Council has not served any notices in accordance with regulation 59E as there are no parish council's in the Borough:
- i) The amount of BCIL collected in the reported year and retained at the end of the reported year is £4,336,163. This is BCIL not assigned for NCIL or BCIL Administration, and that had not been spent.
 - ii) The amount of BCIL collected in previous years (up until 31 March 2019) and retained at the end of the reported year is £11,104,196. This is BCIL not assigned for NCIL or BCIL Administration, that had not been spent.
 - iii) The amount CIL collected in the reported year and retained at the end of the reported year under Regulations 59E and 59F is £813,031. This relates to NCIL which is collected and retained by the Council as the Charging Authority. There are no parishes in the Borough therefore there was no CIL retained in respect of Regulation 59E.
 - iv) The amount of CIL collected in previous years (up until 31 March 2019) and retained at the end of the reported year under Regulations 59E and 59F is £2,123,581.

3. Section 106 Matters

Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) Regulations (2019 Amendment) Regulation 121A Schedule 2 Paragraph 3⁶

- a) The total amount of money to be provided under any planning obligations which were entered during the reported year is **£8,478,621**. This figure does not consider indexation (inflation/deflation) that may be applied when the money becomes due.
- b) The total amount of money under any planning obligations which was received during the reported year was £3,862,786. This figure includes indexation (inflation/deflation) that is applied when the money is paid.
- c) The total amount of money under any planning obligations which was received before the reported year (i.e. before 1 April 2019) that has not been allocated is **£26,062,551**.
- d) During the reported year the following non-monetary contributions have been agreed under planning obligations:
 - i) The total number of affordable housing units to be provided is **5**.
 - ii) There were no onsite education provisions agreed under s106 agreements.

- e) The total amount of money from planning obligations allocated towards infrastructure during the reported year was £2,724,145. Of this amount £2,3399,915 was not spent during the reported year.
- f) The total amount of money from planning obligations spent during the reported year was £1,251,318. Of this amount £0.00 was spent by a third party on behalf of Royal Borough of Kensington and Chelsea.

- £153,886 of monitoring fees was received during the reporting year. The amount of planning obligation money spent in respect of administration of planning obligations and monitoring in relation to the delivery of planning obligations during the reported year was £153,886.

4. Infrastructure List

Community Infrastructure (CIL) Regulations (2019 Amendment) Regulation 121A(1) (a)⁷

The Council is currently in the process of determining how the planning contribution funds will be directed. Decisions will be made as part of the Council's annual capital budget setting process which will be approved in March 2021. The Council has provisionally established the following spend priorities which were agreed by the Leadership Team in November 2020 as part of agreeing the Councils s106 and CIL governance processes⁸.

- Affordable Housing (S106)

- Transport (i.e. highways and traffic works, public transport) (BCIL)
- Employment & Training
