This document, if anything, confirms that little attention has been paid to these large groups of the population (which the Church among others has to support every day of the week). It is hard to imagine how an inclusive community can be created without a proper understanding of these needs.	No change necessary. The EQIA generally shows positive outcomes from the SPD. The authorities consider that the SPD has a positive impact on the need for supported housing (HO15), the needs of Mental Health users (HO15, ES8, SC2 and SC6), the homeless (HO6, HO7, HO15, ES8 and SC6), refugees (HO6, HO7, HO15, ES8 and SC6) and those that cannot aspire to be on the property ladder (HO6 and HO7).

[bold] Equalities Impacts.[end bold] The EqIA claims there are 60 positive impacts, 24 N/A and no negative impacts. Given the basic proposal to demolish the WK and GG estates against the overwhelming wishes of the great majority of the residents (who would be economically worse off if this happens) this cannot be a true assessment of impact. This analysis has no credibility, undermines trust, and needs re-calculation.	Noted. The EQIA will be revisited before the adoption of the SPD.
